

Level 2 - NOCN Award in Emergency First Aid at Work

Emergency First Aid at Work training enables a first-aider to give Emergency First-Aid to someone who is injured or becomes ill while at work.

Do I need previous experience or qualifications to join the course?

No previous experience required but you will need a good level of reading and writing in English to understand written and spoken instruction.

What can I expect to learn?

Patient - including recovery position and dealing with a patient who is in seizure (fitting)*
Shock - causes, recognition and treatment * Wounds and Bleeding Cross Infection/treatment
of external and internal bleeding and minor injuries including small splinters* Managing burns

How will the course be delivered?

The course is run over one day and involves both theory and practical sessions. Certification is dependent on successful continuous assessment. Upon successful completion the certificate is valid for three years.

What do I need to bring?

The wearing of comfortable clothes is advised.
